Recreational and Oversized Vehicle Parking Regulations

The Cypress Municipal Code, Section 16-73, defines oversized vehicles, including RVs, in the following manner:

- Non-motorized vehicle is any vehicle, camp trailer semi-trailer, or trailer coach as defined in the Vehicle Code.
- Oversized vehicle is any vehicle or combination of vehicles that exceed 8 feet high or 22 feet in length or 92 inches in width.
- Commercial vehicle is any vehicle of the type required to be registered as such under the Vehicle Code used or maintained for the transportation of person(s) for hire, compensation, or profit or designed, used, or maintained primarily for transportation of property.



Having defined the various “vehicles” pursuant to the Cypress Municipal Code, the following regulations shall apply:

- Non-motorized vehicles, oversized vehicles and commercial vehicles are prohibited from parking on city streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

Four (4) exceptions exist that provide a mechanism for the Police Chief to issue temporary overnight parking permits.

- Permit issued to a visitor or temporary house guests for a period of 7 days. The RV must be registered in a city other than Cypress. The RV must be moved at least 1/10th of a mile every 72 hours and must be moved on street sweeping day.
- Permit issued for an RV belonging to a new resident of Cypress or a newly purchased vehicle. The permit is issued for a maximum of 30 days while the owner locates a storage facility. The vehicle must be moved every 72 hours and must be moved on street sweeping day.
- Permit issued when the RV is used as the sole means of transportation. Permit issued for a 12-month period. The owner is required to provide documentation that the RV is the sole means of transportation.

- A Permit may be issued for the loading and unloading of an RV. The permit is valid for a **maximum of 24 hours**. These permits cannot be used in succession to increase the permitted parking from 24 hours to 48 hours. ***This permit is for the loading and unloading of the RV only***, and not for the purpose of parking, storage or maintenance of the RV.

How to obtain a permit...

To obtain one of the permits described above the owner must request the permit at the Cypress Police Department during normal business hours and pay a \$10.00 fee. If granted, permits will be issued for the loading and unloading of RV's for a **maximum period of 24 hours**. Permits for guests, new residents, new RV's or sole means of transportation vehicles may also be obtained during normal business hours.

Trailers must be attached to a vehicle between 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM (with permit).
